Congratulations to our District Governor Mercedes Balli, DTM, who led the effort on reaching 61 clubs for the Aloha District! Toastmasters International had levied on us the requirement to maintain 60 clubs in good standing or lose the District Charter. This was a “do or die” situation for District 49. Undaunted with the challenge, she worked with her team to develop prospective clubs, run down leads, and resurrect interest in Toastmasters in key organizations.

As of April 1st, paperwork has been forwarded to TI HQ, and District 49 can now claim it has 61 clubs. Mercedes is quick to point out accomplishing this was a team effort. The Hawaii Island Christian Speech & Debate Association (HICSDA) held its annual **Individual Event National Qualifier Tournament** on April 2-3, 2004 at Yano Hano Educational Center (Schofield). The members believe formal speech and debate can provide a means for home- schooled students to learn and exercise analytical and oratorical skills, addressing life issues.

For its 5th year, 93 students participated in 11 different speech events: Dramatic Interpretation, Duo Impromptu, Duo Interpretation, Expository, Extemporaneous, Humorous, Interpretation, Impromptu, Open Interpretation, Original Oratory, and Persuasive Speaking.

About 150 judges took part of the event, 6 of them were Toastmasters. After a long rewarding day awed by all the talented young speakers, about 15 students will represent HICSDA to the Nationals in Lynchburg, VA.

Would you like your club to be distinguished for this Toastmaster year? Have you looked at your Distinguished Club Plan (DCP) report lately? Go to the TI website. WWW.Toastmasters.org and under Member Quicklinks, click on Club DCP Reports. Click on Launch Reports, then enter your Club#. You will know well in advance what you need to do help your club achieve the goals needed to reach Distinguished status. One very important point to remember is that your club can reach all of your clubs goals, but if you do not have a net increase of five new members, if your club is below 20 members by June 30, 2004 your club cannot be Distinguished. Continue your good work and share your Toastmasters experience with everyone you meet.

This has been a great year for me and the District team. Lt. Gov. Education and Training Larry Lands has achieved his Goals as set forth by Toastmasters International. Lt. Gov Marketing Terrance Roughton has achieved most of his goals also. We are so fortunate to have dedicated Area and Division Governors and district staff members.
